17) Introduction of an ordinance to authorize continuing authority and health care coverage of employees with certain acquired terms of uninterrupted or combined city full-time service; to authorize the vesting periods therefor; to provide for the qualifications and circumstances of continued health care eligibility coverage under the city employee and/or retiree plan; to provide for the health retiree status related thereto; to provide for such continuing authority as applicable hereunder relative to and exclusively regarding elected city officials and unclassified employees; to authorize amendments and provisions to existing policies and plans to implement the policies set forth herein; to provide relative to the city group contracts of insurance insuring city employees and to amend same to add officials and provide additionally for unclassified employees under policies of group insurance covering hospitalization and care for such employees and officials in the post-employment context; to provide for a match of the payments of the employees and officials for the premiums or charges for any such contracts payable out of the funds of such municipality or political subdivision; to provide for the purpose of paying the employer's share of postemployment benefits of employees, all as prescribed by this ordinance and its amendment of all previous related ordinances by adding new officials and unclassified employees to the list of eligible persons; to provide relative to any such fund for the purpose of paying the employer's share of post-employment benefits of employees of the city created by, or for which taxes are levied by, the city which may receive and deposit in the fund any monies which may be lawfully used for the purpose of the fund; and further to provide for all matters related thereto.

- Introduction of an ordinance authorizing expenditures and 18) cooperative endeavor agreements for vendors and food and event services related to the inauguration and installation services and official events for the new Mayor of Alexandria and Council members; for onboarding and transition services and emergency response training; for all matters related to the peaceful, seamless and effective transition of former to new leadership at the city; for provision of a budget related thereto to be used from existing and appropriate travel and training, economic development, and administrative budgets; and appropriations for the ordinary expenses of all city divisions, departments, offices and agencies with respect to multiple events, security, memorialization, street closures and public safety, and other related matters to a safe, secure, and appropriate inaugural ceremony and transition including those professional services needed therefor.
